
In our middle school, we:

Emphasize Respect. Students are free to approach our intentionally-present teachers to share any concerns. Parents can access an anonymous tip line, contributing to the safety of children within our community. Peer Counseling with our high school juniors and seniors encourages respect for others and a heart for service.

Build Authentic Relationships. Teachers serve as mentors, building meaningful relationships centered on encouragement, care, and support. Our dedicated staff helps middle schoolers understand that they can make mistakes, take risks, and embrace failure as a tool for growth. They help our students expand their understanding of the Gospel, develop biblical character, and forge meaningful relationships with their peers and with Christ.

Foster Character Development. Westminster's weekly Chapel gathers the whole community for teaching and worship, fostering character growth centered on the Word of God. Christ's influence is felt in every part of our learning environment, from the classroom and Chapel to the athletic fields and performing arts arena.

Our middle school students are engaged, active, and discerning learners who will grow into tomorrow's leaders. We help students learn to view failure as an important part of the learning process, which ultimately contributes to their success. With this mindset, they become capable of handling a more rigorous curriculum that will prepare them for high school and college.

Westminster students stand out from their peers because we:

Encourage Goal Setting. We believe that middle school is a training ground for developing lifelong skills. Our weekly advisory meeting allows middle schoolers to reflect and set three goals. Students discuss and plan with teachers how they can achieve these goals independently.

Develop Critical Thinking. Beyond memorizing facts, we encourage students to process their learning and make connections across multiple disciplines. Our teachers remind students that making mistakes is part of growth, which fuels creativity and critical thinking. Assessments are built-in to see how middle schoolers integrate what they've learned into real-life situations.

Responsible Technology Use. We believe technology provides opportunities to foster learning in unique, innovative ways when used responsibly. Teachers utilize technology in the classroom when it benefits students and elevates the learning experience, always emphasizing digital safety.

Emphasize Autonomy. As a community, we encourage students to engage in learning by creating work representing understanding and growth. Westminster also promotes a culture of self-advocacy — weekly advising, open communication with teachers, and peer mentorship all contribute to independence.

Westminster's foundation for academic excellence is displayed through our rigorous core subjects — emphasizing goal setting, critical thinking skills, time management, and a deep understanding of the Gospel — equipping students with a lifelong love of learning.

Leadership Opportunities

Club Leadership and SANFAN (See a Need, Fill a Need) are leadership roles that our students enjoy. Middle schoolers identify opportunities to mentor others, plan projects, and engage in activities that promote creativity and collaboration.

On or off the field or court — we're always proud of our athletes. Our Wildcats play hard and have helped develop the character of a very long line of Westminster graduates. We offer 26 team sports and have proudly won three team state championships and six individual state championships.

Enriched Learning

Favorite middle school electives include STEM Academy, Fine Arts, Theatre Arts, Band and Choir, World Language, Ocean Discovery, and Introduction to Coding. Our clubs, such as Scholar Bowl, Archery, and Robotics, engage students in their passions as they spend meaningful time with friends.

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Location

Where is the campus? Our campus is located off Highway 40, between 141 and 270, in Town & Country, Missouri. Most of our students live within a 5- to 20-minute radius of our school. We do not offer transportation services but can help connect families through our Parent Connector program for ride-shares.

Schedule

How does a school fit into your family's schedule? Westminster's middle school schedule runs from 7:55 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with Thursdays starting at 9:30 a.m.

Communication Expectations

How does communication work between the home and the school? Every Saturday, parents receive a newsletter containing helpful information, upcoming events, and announcements for middle and upper school students. We also have a digital school management system that keeps families updated about student progress and more. Parents are welcome to participate in prayer groups that strengthen our spiritual community.

Growth Opportunities

What happens when your child makes a mistake and needs some guidance? Our dedication to honoring Jesus Christ is our guide in upholding biblical standards for discipline. Through a partnership of the home, church, and school, we correct behaviors in a relational process with the ultimate goal of restoration.



INVITING YOUR MIDDLE SCHOOLER TO JOIN THE CONVERSATION

Middle school will be a significant time in your child's life as they learn to embrace and develop their unique talents and interests. This special season should be so much more than something they endure on their way to high school.

We love hearing that more middle school students are getting involved with their school choice. But how exactly should you invite your child into the conversation?

Be intentional and ask specific

questions. Try asking your child about an interest or subject they would like to develop further rather than broad questions such as "What school do you want to go to?" If they are interested in robotics, help them look for a school with a strong STEM program and electives to support their growing interests.

Ask your middle schooler what they

need from you. Do they want your advice as they share their thoughts on the subject? Or do they need a listening ear as they process? Letting them talk through this decision allows them to practice selfadvocacy — an important skill they will strengthen in middle school. Understand that communication doesn't have to be conversation. Identify interests you can explore together and use those as a foundation for connecting. If your child doesn't want to talk about school at the dinner table but loves to be outdoors, consider taking a walk or riding a bike together. Chances are, they'll open up when they're in their comfort zone and doing something they love.

Be curious, not critical. Middle schoolers are sensitive to criticism and crave your approval (even if it doesn't always feel that way). Encourage your child by listening to their ideas and helping them see the value of attending a school that meets their needs.
